GOVERNMENT'S EXHIBITS RESPONSIVE TO IMMIGRATION JUDGE'S JUNE 16, 2005, ORDER

The Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), respectfully submits the following exhibits after completing the search of government records in response to the Immigration Judge's Order dated June 16, 2005.

BACKGROUND

On June 7, 2005, the respondents requested that the Immigration Judge issue an order requiring the government to turn over any potentially exculpatory evidence in the above captioned matter. The respondents further requested the government make a formal request to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and make a good faith effort

to obtain information as to any potentially exculpatory evidence regarding certain organizations. To ensure that the exact nature of the Immigration Judge's order was conveyed to the FBI, ICE requested that the Immigration Judge memorialize the order into written form. On June 16, 2005, the Immigration Judge memorialized his verbal instructions and indicated that the instructions should be implemented no later than June 27, 2005. ICE complied with the requirements by the Court's June 27, 2005, deadline.

A. ICE Compliance with the June 16, 2005, Order by the June 27, 2005, deadline.

The Immigration Judge's Order, date June 16, 2005, contains six requirements and in paragraph (7) states that "(T)he above-stated instructions should be implemented no later than June 27, 2005." ICE implemented the six requirements before the June 27, 2005, deadline, as set forth below:

1. Good Faith Search for Potentially Exculpatory Evidence

The first instruction states that, "(T)he Government is to conduct a good faith effort to search for and turn over any potentially exculpatory evidence." The government previously conducted searches for exculpatory evidence in response to orders issued by the Immigration Judge on October 26, 1992, and June 24, 1993. The government submitted the results based upon those orders. After the Immigration Judge issued the written order on June 16, 2005, the government again began a search for exculpatory evidence relating to the respondents¹.

2. Formal Request of the FBI Regarding the Existence of Exculpatory Evidence

ICE implemented the second requirement of the Immigration Judge's order prior to the June 27, 2005, deadline. ICE made a formal request to the FBI on June 21, 2005, to issue a statement responsive to the Immigration Judge's order and forwarded a copy of the order. Thus, ICE complied with the requirement to make a formal request by June 27, 2005. On January 23, 2006, ICE received a response from the FBI; that response is attached as Exhibit 1.

3. <u>Good Faith Effort to Search for Exculpatory Evidence Related to Other</u> <u>Organizations</u>

At the respondents' request, the Immigration Judge also ordered the government to obtain any exculpatory evidence regarding numerous alleged charitable entities. Specifically, the Immigration Judge ordered:

> The Government is to make a good faith effort to obtain information as to any potentially exculpatory evidence that tends to show that any of the charitable entities financially supported by US

OMEN South Bay Chapter between the years 1984-1986 were not fronts for nor parts of the PFLP, or would tend to otherwise show that they are or were independent of the PFLP, in regards to the following agencies:....

ICE initiated a review of its material for any "potentially exculpatory evidence" related to those groups prior to June 27, 2005. ICE's review of its evidence in the case did not reveal any potentially exculpatory evidence relating to these groups other than the material described in section B.3.

4. Statements Signed by Respondents

The government previously submitted several documents signed by the respondents as exhibits in this case. ICE has also supplied the respondents with copies of any statements signed by the respondents upon receipt of a request for such a document. In addition, ICE is now submitting additional documents signed by respondents. See Section B.4.

B. ICE's Continued Compliance with the June 16, 2005, Order After June 27, 2005

On July 7, 2005, the Immigration Judge cancelled the hearing scheduled on this case. Since the cancellation of the hearing date, ICE has continued to review all materials in its case file for this matter in an effort to provide a thorough response to the Immigration Judge's order. ICE has completed its review of all the material related to this case in its possession. See Exhibit 2 (Declaration of Special Agent Chris Laska). ICE has thereby complied with the Immigration Judge's order by implementing the searches prior to June 27, 2005, and now submits the following after completing its review.

1. Good Faith Search for Potentially Exculpatory Evidence

As previously stated, ICE did not search material previously submitted to the Court by the government and the respondents during the course of these proceedings or the related federal litigation, as the respondents already are in possession of that material. ICE submits the following material resulting from its search that is potentially exculpatory:

(1) Children's books from Scottish Rite Temple
 (2) Flyers from Scottish Rite Temple

2. FBI Response to ICE Formal Request

On January 23, 2006, ICE received a response from the FBI that is attached as Exhibit 1.

3. <u>Good Faith Effort to Search for Exculpatory Evidence Related to Other</u> <u>Organizations</u>

After completing its review of all material in its possession in this case, ICE has identified the following documents that may reference some of the designated groups and potentially may or may not be exculpatory:

(1) Translation of "Important Statement" flyer (Palestinian Women);

(2) Translation of "Activity Program" (Ghassan Kanafani); and

(3) Zachary Papers (Palestinian Women Committee).

4. Statements Signed by Respondents

After completing its review of all material in its possession in this case, ICE has identified the following documents, which constitute all documents signed by the respondents that may not have previously been submitted:

<u>CONCLUSION</u>

ICE respectfully submits the foregoing to the Immigration Judge in compliance with his June 27, 2005, order. The wide-reaching order of the Immigration Judge regarding potentially exculpatory material has led to hundreds of man-hours in search of potentially responsive evidence, including voluminous materials that have not previously fallen under any other orders regarding exculpatory evidence². This search also required the ongoing coordination of numerous governmental agencies, including some that are not parties to this matter. Consequently, ICE was only recently able to complete this exhaustive search in compliance with the Court's order.

² ICE has not previously asserted that the agencies referenced in the Immigration Judge's June 27, 2005, order were fronts or part of the PFLP. For this reason, it is ICE's belief that the organizations did not fall under the 1992 and 1993 orders of the Immigration Judge regarding exculpatory evidence in this matter. As such, ICE could not have anticipated that it would be required to search for exculpatory evidence regarding these agencies. ICE initiated the search as soon as it was order to do so by the Immigration Judge.

The FBI is in receipt of a copy of an Order, dated June 16, 2005 ("June 16th Order"), issued by United States Immigration Judge Bruce J. Einhorn in the above referenced matters. The June 16th Order contains the following paragraph:

> The Government [U.S. Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE")] is to make a formal request of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to issue a statement with regard to the specific question of the existence or nonexistence of potential exculpatory evidence regarding the specific activities of Respondents.

On the face of the June 16th Order, the "Respondents" referenced therein are identified as Mr. Michel Ibrahim Shehadeh and Mr.

I note that, Judge Einhorn indicated, in an Order issued in the instant case and dated October 26, 1992 ("October 26th Order"), "The Federal Rules of Civil Procedure [much less criminal procedure] are not applicable in deportation proceedings, and there is no requirement that requests for discovery be honored," citing <u>Matter of Magana</u>, 17 I.N.N. Dec. 111 (B.I.A. 1979). Insofar as the June 16th Order indirectly references the FBI, it appears, on its face, to envision that ICE request that the FBI provide a statement as to the existence or nonexistence of exculpatory evidence regarding Mr. Shehadeh and Mr. Hamide. I have received a letter from your agency, containing the referenced request. I further interpret your agency's request as follows:

I interpret the term "exculpatory evidence" to mean, "Evidence tending to establish a criminal defendant's innocence." Black's Law Dictionary 597 (8th ed. 2004).

I do not understand your agency to be requesting that the FBI search for, and provide, information which is in the public domain (newspaper, magazine articles, Internet materials, etc.) with regard to the instant case. I also do not interpret your agency's letter to request that the FBI provide documents or other materials which have already been disclosed in discovery or otherwise made part of the record in this case. Additionally, I do not interpret your agency's letter to request that the FBI provide information which could not be lawfully disseminated and/or information which would not be subject to discovery.

In addition to Judge Einhorn's Order of October 26, 1992, I am aware that Judge Einhorn issued an Order, dated June 24, 1993 ("June 24th Order"). The October 26th and June 24th Orders taken together appear to have directed "the Government" (including the FBI) to produce certain exculpatory information in 1993. The FBI appears to have responded to the foregoing Orders with a sworn declaration by Supervisory Special Agent Lucy Ann Hoover ("Hoover Declaration"), dated September 10, 1993. The Hoover Declaration described information found in an FBI search of its records (dating to September 1993), "[W]hich would tend to

contradict or disprove any representations of record made by government counsel," in the instant case. I understand and believe that the Hoover Declaration has previously been made part of the papers filed in this case and I request that the Hoover Declaration be incorporated by reference into the FBI's response to ICE's current request for exculpatory evidence.

Accordingly, I consider your agency's current request for information to encompass that information generated and in the possession of the FBI since September 10, 1993 -- the date of the Hoover Declaration.

Given our above-described understanding of your agency's current request, the limits on formal discovery previously acknowledged in this case, and subject to, and without waiving any objections to the above-referenced portion of the June 16th Order which the FBI may assert at law, our response to ICE's request for a statement regarding the existence of exculpatory evidence concerning Mr. Shehadeh and Mr. Hamide is as follows:

Pursuant to your agency's request, we have conducted an electronic search of FBI records for exculpatory evidence regarding Mr. Shehadeh and Mr. Hamide in our possession which dates since September 10, 1993. The electronic search included a search of the FBI's central records system using the Respondents' names and three variations of phonetic spellings of the Respondents' names. (The dates of birth of the Respondents were also used to facilitate identification of potentially responsive records.) The FBI's electronic search for records which could be reasonably construed as exculpatory evidence regarding Mr. Shehadeh and Mr. Hamide has not yielded any documents responsive to your agency's request.

We have also attempted to identify physical records regarding the instant case which are believed to be located in our office in Los Angeles, California. The FBI's Los Angeles office has been the subject of the FBI's attempt to identify physical records potentially responsive to ICE's current request for records because this immigration matter has been pending before the Office of the Immigration Judge in Los Angeles and, as Letter to Mr. Javad Khzaeli January 24, 2006

a result, we believe in good faith that the FBI's physical records relating to this matter are likely to be found in our Los Angeles.

The FBI's initial survey of its records in its Los Angeles office which may be responsive to ICE's request arising from the June 16th Order has revealed that there are only limited numbers of records which are potentially responsive to your agency's request. Of the records in the possession of the FBI which are potentially responsive to your agency's request, I have been given to understand that no records constitute "exculpatory evidence" regarding the Respondents as we interpret that term.

Accordingly, please be advised that the FBI has not, to date, identified any records which would reasonably constitute exculpatory evidence regarding Mr. Shehadeh and Mr. Hamide. I regret that we have been unable to locate or provide further information which would be of assistance to ICE.

However, I understand that your agency has been in contact with former FBI Special Agent Frank Knight regarding this matter. I am told that Mr. Knight was a principal FBI case agent formerly assigned to this matter and I am also told that he has substantial organizational "memory" regarding the evidence which the FBI came to obtain through its investigative efforts. It is my hope that, perhaps Mr. Knight may be able to further assist your agency in its request for exculpatory information. If you have additional questions regarding this matter, please do not hesitate to contact me at (202) 324-1743.

At a time when the glorious Uprising of the Palestinian people in the occupied territories against Israeli occupation and its supporters continues and escalates, at the same time the forces hostile towards our Palestinian people and our Arab nation, which are supportive of Israel, escalate their onslaught which aims to attack and liquidate the Palestinian cause, the central Arab cause, whether on the general political level of the Middle East problem or on the local level in the United States, where this onslaught took on different forms in the past, such as the assassination of Alex Aouda and the fabrication of the case of the Eight in Los Angeles. Lately this onslaught took on a new qualitative form when the Congress passed a law declaring that the P.L.O, the legitimate and sole representative of the Palestinian people, was a terrorist organization and, in effect, the Congress forbade its political presence in the United States. It is the law that the President adopted when he signed a bill of authorization for the Department of State on 23/12/87 and this bill will go into force on 21/3/88. The real purpose of this law is not only to shut down the Palestinian Information Office in Washington, which was actually closed by the State Department before the passage of the law, and not only to close the Organization's Mission to the United Nations, despite the great political importance of maintaining the Mission in this international framework to preserve the presence of our people among the peoples of the world in this international arena, but to deal a blow to the P.L.O and to slander it on the international level. The goal is also to strike down the Palestinian national action and the Arab action in the interest of the cause in the American arena as well as any American sympathy with it, through pressure and intimidation that will charge those sympathizers with interacting with the Organization. We could almost state that the grand purpose is to prevent any serious political development in the popular and official American position with regards to the Palestinian cause and the Middle East crisis. The passing of this law, despite the sharp opposition to it on the part of wide sectors of American citizens, the civil rights organizations, and even individuals in the Government itself, comes as a new expression of the spite and hatred which is harbored

by the anti- Palestinian and generally anti- Arab forces and for all their just causes. It is the same hatred that is harbored by the forces hostile to the causes of struggling peoples.

Perhaps what is more important than all of this is (ILL) this racist law. It came as an assault on civil rights and as a violation of the constitutional rights of the American citizen and the rights of residents, at the top of which is the right of (ILL), expression and (ILL), and it is rather an assault on the Constitution itself in many areas. On this basis it is perfectly possible to bring down this law and defeat...

Oh heroes of the glorious Uprising, oh masses of brave students, oh academicians!

One of the pillars of the Zionist policy is based on unlearnedness of our people and the deprivation of their simplest right as laid down in the international covenants and customs, which is the right to education. Therefore, the occupying powers closed all educational institutions, universities, institutes of higher learning and schools thereby depriving about onethird of a million students from receiving education. The National United Command of the Uprising decided to confront the decisions of the racist occupation by defying them. It calls upon the masses of students and teachers and the (ILL) of the educational institutions to jointly confront and challenge, in all locations, the decision of the occupying powers through the organization of the education process on a national basis, and to defeat the policy of unlearnedness practiced against the masses of our people. The National United Command also appeals to all international bodies and institutions to support our people's struggle to frustrate this policy.

Oh merchants, professionals and artisans! In implementation of and in unison with the program of the Uprising and the comprehensive popular revolution, let us cut off one of the economic veins of the occupation and state "no" out loud to taxes in all their forms. They are the vein from which the occupation finances its tools of oppression and its Nazi army. Let us declare it once more, should the battle of taxes commence, that you are against taxes, through the organization of your ranks and your collective and united stand. And with you side by side will be the masses of the Uprising. The accountants have an important role in this battle. Let March be the month when our stolen money will cease to flow into the treasury of occupying powers. We are confident that the unity of these sectors and the unity of our people's position in refraining from paying taxes will inflict a defeat upon the occupation [sic] in addition to the defeats it has already suffered.

Oh masses of our people! While the National United Command is waging the battle with you and through you, and in order to avoid anything that may harm our strugglers and our ability to remain steadfast, following a discussion of a number of issues that are of concern to our masses regarding especially the sectors of production and necessary services, and in order to achieve the goals of our Uprising and the highest

possible level of boycotting the Zionist goods that could be replaced locally or could be done without, the National United Command decided the following:

- To maintain the current arrangement of opening commercial stores for two to three hours daily in accordance with the circumstances of each area.
- 2) To keep our productive plants functioning at full capacity in order to achieve the greatest level of boycotting Zionist goods. These plants shall go on strike only during the days of comprehensive strikes declared by the United Command of the Uprising- the leadership of the P.L.O.
- 3) Regarding rural industrial areas (outside cities), commercial places, (ILL), garages etc., these areas are to be open for work from morning until 1 p.m., except on the days of comprehensive strikes, when they shall close their doors.
- 4) To keep all clinics, sanitariums and health centers open all the time.
- 5) To not pay monetary fines imposed by the Zionist and Fascist military courts on the arrested sons of our people.

...Big (ILL) stands behind it. Thus, we all have to work towards the mobilization of our forces and to rally the widest sectors of citizens. We know that many American groups have actually started a movement to oppose this law constitutionally in court on the basis of protecting the Constitution, which requires us all to move effectively in support of this movement on the popular, media and financial levels. Standing together side by side, our contribution in this effort and our imparting the required importance to it will only guarantee the defeat of the hostile forces and the preservation of local and national interests and, rather, our interests as individuals having a just and common cause that holds us together.

Oh masses of our struggling people! Your glorious Uprising continues, and your heroic challenge to the Occupation army escalates, and the cowardly settlers and their agents suffer grave losses thereby realizing every day new achievements. The Zionist butcher Rabin cannot but implicitly acknowledge defeat. There he is finally acknowledging that our people are waging a civil war. The occupation, oh our heroes, has been defeated politically and finds no one except American Imperialism trying to rescue it from certain defeat. The occupation has been defeated economically and its official figures about its direct losses in the stock market and productive projects because of the strike of our heroic workers surpassed (2000) million dollars. The occupation has been defeated militarily. Its huge machine of oppression is unable to confront the stones, the Molotov's and the will of the revolting people. With regard to its soldiers and Fascist settlers, they do not enjoy security and twothirds of its soldiers who step foot on the soil of our homeland report to the psychological sanitariums for treatment. There you are, oh heroes of the Uprising, raising every day the cost of the Occupation and increasing its losses. You are marching with firmness and fortitude, and a will that does not recognize retreat, towards the establishment of your independent state under the leadership of our sole and legitimate representative, the P.L.O. 2 - The formation of an artistic group from the scouting apparatus, to consist of: a <u>dabkah</u> group - a singing group - an acting group.

4 - The athletic arena: In which a table tennis team is formed and athletic exercises are held.

5 - Outside excursions: In which outside excursions for the Lion Cubs and Flowers take place once a month in order to activate the scouting spirit.

6 - Regular visits to the scouts' families in order to strengthen the tie between the PYO and the families.

7 - Expanding the scouting apparatus and building the cadre.

8 - Activity to give methodological lessons - in which our comrade teachers will participate.

9 - Action to distinguish the Ghassan Kanafani Institute from the scouting apparatus.

Fourth: On the cultural level:

1 - Consolidating the branch's cultural committee and its regular meetings.

2 - During the month of February, a seminar on the political situation given by a member of the Front's politburo.

- We ask that you send us any information which you can provide on future theoretical sessions so that we can ask comrades to prepare themselves to participate in them.

Combative Context:

- The General Union of Palestinian Students: Preliminary statistics on the results of the registration in the units is that we are number 1 in the branch.

We face the following problems:

+ `Arafat's Fatah: Their danger is that they might reject the registration results and to demand a new registration. This will occur if they were positive. They could also challenge the present Administrative Committee and form a temporary committee to prepare for the branch conference. This is because the majority of the Administrative Committee members are from the Opposition Movement.

+ The DFLP: They ally themselves with the `Arafat group, refuse to register their supporters, and are wagering on the position of `Arafat's Fatah.

- Our tactics for the coming stage: We will be flexible with everyone until the conference. Consequently, any error from any party would be contained at the conference and be revealed to the majority of the unit representatives. We contacted `Arafat's group and in palliative language told them that we were prepared, at the highest level, to be flexible in whatever they wish. We contacted the DFLP and gave them the impression that there were contacts between us and `Arafat's group and that we agree on most issues. We asked them to coordinate with us. We contacted the opposition movement group and assured them about the results of the elections and that, in the final analysis, most of the coordination would be between us.

- The administrative body will meet on 3/10/84 in order to agree on the preparations for registration and elections in the branch units. We will make every effort to see to it that the Union's affairs proceed smoothly because it has the lion's share of the leadership in the units and at the conference, it will be ours.

Women's Activity:

During the course of the women's activity in the region, we will have a unit for the Palestinian Women's Committee in every city in which we have female supporters. Thereafter, we will establish a Union of Palestinian Women's Committees, which will be the dynamo which motivates the existing women's societies in a number of regions and will lead to the establishment of a branch for the General Union of Palestinian Women.

The first issue of a special newsletter on women's activity will be published: <u>Sawt al-Mar'ah al-Filastiniyyah</u> [The <u>Palestinian Woman's Voice</u>]. It will be published by the Palestinian Women's Committees.

This International Women's Day will be this committee's focus this week.

Financial Context:

The financial report is attached.

We have two questions concerning finance:

1) How do we conduct ourselves regarding private cars: In a large city like Chicago, for example, a comrade member of the regional leadership cannot move about without a car, while carrying out his numerous political, organizational, and unionrelated responsibilities. He requests a car from the party and we refuse because no cars are allocated abroad. He asks, "How do I get around? Should I rent a car for every task, even though this would cost no less than ten dollars?" Our answer is "no." The debate goes back and forth. "What if I get a loan, make a down payment, pay it off in installments, and it is used only for party business? What happens if there is any damage to the car? What about gasoline? . . . Please tell us what we should do.

2) As indicated in the financial guidelines, the party pays the doctor and hospital bills for a full-time member who is ill. In our case, what should we do if a comrade comes down with a sickness which costs thousands of dollars. If the disease is critical, it could cost us thousands of dollars. We face the same problem if the spouse becomes ill. The only solution we can see is to buy an "insurance policy" for the full-time comrades in order to spare ourselves great financial difficulties. If we did this, it would cost us 1000-1500 dollars per month. <u>What should</u> we do?

You are being detained by an Officer of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, because you are an alien who is in the United States illegally. This notice describes those options available to you. You must sign below to show that you have received a copy of this notice and understand it. Please read this notice carefully before deciding what you wish to do.

1. Right to a Deportation Hearing

You have the right to a deportation hearing to determine whether you may remain in the United States. If you request a deportation hearing, you may be represented at the hearing by counsel at no expense to the government of the United States. To insure your presence at your hearing you may be detained unless you are able to post a sum of money which you will lose if you do not appear. If you appear at all required hearings and other requests for appearance, your money will be returned.

2. Opportunity for Voluntary Departure

If you want to return to your home country, you may ask to be allowed to depart on the first available transportation. If your request is granted you will give up your opportunity for a deportation hearing and your opportunity to apply for other relief. If you change your mind at any time before you actually go home you will be given a deportation hearing.

3. Representation by Counsel

You may be represented by counsel of your choice at no expense to the Government of the United States. If you wish legal advice and cannot afford it, you may ask for a list of available free legal services. You may contact counsel at this time or at any time prior to your departure from the United States.

4. Communication with Consul

You may talk to the consular or diplomatic officers of your country or nationality.

Request for Disposition

I acknowledge that I have received a copy of the above notice and understand it.

I understand my options and I request one of the following dispositions of my case. I understand that if the Government pays for my transportation out of the United States, I cannot return for five years unless I first obtain permission from the Attorney General.

1. I wish to request a hearing before an Immigration Judge to determine whether I may remain in, or will be deported from the United States.
